Content

This course is intended for students without any previous knowledge of Swedish. It offers basic grammatical instruction regarding the use of the present and past tenses, as well as the imperative form, of verbs. For nouns it covers the usage of the singular and plural forms and the definite and indefinite articles. The comparison system of adjectives and the different pronouns are also explained. All grammatical issues are dealt with through a method of contrasting between English and Swedish. Semantic aspects of the Swedish language are also penetrated. The learning of vocabulary is focused on words that can be used to make presentations and that have to do with family, food, habitation and leisure activities. The course focusses mainly on communicative exercises whereby students can gain an opportunity to practice their skills. The improvement of written and oral proficiency is tested continuously. Apart from linguistic aspects, the tuition also embraces some civic knowledge about Swedish life.

Learning Outcomes

On completing the course the student should be able to

1. Knowledge and comprehension

- 1,1 recognize common words and very simple phrases that concern the student or fellow students and teachers
- 1,2 understand common words and very simple sentences

2. Skills and proficiency

- 2,1 pose and answer questions regarding every-day topics
- 2,2 use simple phrases and sentences in order to describe living quarters and interests
- 2,3 write short, simple messages e.g. e-mails and complete forms regarding personal details

3. Evaluation ability and attitude

3,1 contrast Swedish culture and society with experience from other cultures and societies

On completing the course the student is to have reached a level of Swedish that corresponds to level A1 in accordance with the European Common Framework of References.

Forms of Teaching

The teaching in the course consists of

- Lectures
- Recorded material
- Workshops

There are three levels of assessment: Fail (F, Fx), Pass (E, D and C) and Pass with Distinction (B, A). To gain a Pass for the whole course is the student must have attained at least the grade E for each of the four examinations. An all-embracive grade for the course will be awarded according to the following scale: Grade E = > 4 ECTS awarded an E Grade D = > 4 ECTS awarded a D Grade C = > 4 ECTS awarded a C Grade B = > 4 ECTS awarded a B with no result below level E. Grade A = > 4 ECTS awarded an A with no result below level B.

Students who have not passed the examinations can be granted a certificate of attendance.

If the student has received a decision/recommendation regarding special pedagogical support from the University of Borås due to disability or special needs, the examiner has the right to make accommodations when it comes to examination. The examiner must, based on the objectives of the course syllabus, determine whether the examination can be adapted in accordance with the decision/recommendation.
