Content

This course is a follow-up to Part One of the Basic Course in Swedish. It is aimed for students who have already attained a rudimental command of the Swedish language (A1). It covers the use of the present perfect and past perfect tenses of main verbs and also of auxiliary verbs. From the point of view of syntax, it clarifies the distinction between main clauses and sub-clauses, and the different conjunctions that connect them. Also included will be the irregularities of the comparison of adjectives. Vocabulary building will concern the areas of studies and professions. The rules for the pronunciation of Swedish will also be gone into. The course relies mainly on communicative training which enables the students to exercise the skills they have acquired. Written and oral tasks are performed and marked continuously. The course also involves gaining an understanding of Swedish customs both regarding student matters and in general.

Learning Outcomes

On completing the course, the student should be able to

1. Knowledge and comprehension

1,1 recognize phrases and common words that have to do with the student's personal life, every-day activities and studies or work

2. Skills and proficiency

2,1 read and understand simple texts.

2,2 find information in uncomplicated and familiar texts such as a factual text or an excerpt from a diary

2,3 participate in conversations that demand a straightforward exchange of information on familiar topics or activities

2,4 make use of a set of phrases and sentences in order to create a basic presentation of the life conditions of a student, of current studies and of future or present work

2,5 write a comprehensible text with the aim of describing incidents in the past, the present and the future with the aid of a dictionary

2,6 understand language which is pronounced with minor deficiencies but without destructive flaws

3. Evaluation ability and attitude

3,1 contrast Swedish study-practices and living conditions with personal experiences, ongoing studies and future or present work.

On completing the course, the student is to have reached a level of Swedish that corresponds to level A2 in accordance with the European Common Framework of References.

Forms of Teaching

The tuition in the course consists of

There are three levels of assessment: Fail (F, Fx), Pass (E, D and C) and Pass with Distinction (B, A).

To gain a Pass for the whole course is the student must have attained at least the grade E for each of the four examinations.

An all-embracing grade for the course will be awarded according to the following scale:

Grade E = > 4 ECTS awarded an E

Grade D = > 4 ECTS awarded a D

Grade C = > 4 ECTS awarded a C

Grade B = > 4 ECTS awarded a B with no result below level E.

Grade A = > 4 ECTS awarded an A with no result below level B.

Students who have not passed the examinations can be granted a certificate of attendance.

If the student has received a decision/recommendation regarding special pedagogical support from the University of Borås due to disability or special needs, the examiner has the right to make accommodations when it comes to examination. The examiner must, based on the objectives of the course syllabus, determine whether the examination can be adapted in accordance with the decision/recommendation.
