Content

The course seeks to develop basic skills in design methodology and a deeper knowledge of design development through basic illustration and visualisation methods for developing design ideas in terms of form and materials. Main content of the course:

- Identifying and developing design methods
- Applying design methodology in project work
- Digital visualisation, technical product illustration and specification plus presentation techniques
- Different design methods in relation to ethics and the environment

Learning Outcomes

After completing and passing the course, students should be able to:

- 1. demonstrate basic skills and capabilities in design methodology.
- 2. demonstrate basic knowledge and understanding of the role of design methodology in design development.
- 3. describe and analyse the design process of their own work.
- 4. demonstrate basic knowledge and understanding of the role of design methodology in terms of quality, ethics and the environment.

The main focus of the course is on learning outcomes: 1a, 2a, 4a-b.

Forms of Teaching

Teaching consists of lectures and supervision.

The language of instruction is Swedish. However, instruction in English may occur.

Forms of Examination

The course will be examined through the following examination elements

- Documentation of and reflection on design methodology work (Learning outcomes 1-3) 5 credits Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)
- Oral presentation (Learning outcomes 1-3) 2,5 credits Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)
