Content

- Theory of art within contemporary art
- Searching for information through course literature, literature selected by the student and other media
- Interpretative exercises

Learning Outcomes

The course aims to explore methods within contemporary art and to place these in relation to design methodology within textile design through interpretative exercises.

After completing the course, students should be able to:

- 1. demonstrate knowledge and understanding of dominant methods and theories within contemporary art,
- 2. be able to describe and analyse the working methods of selected artists,
- 3. be able to identify links between the processes of contemporary art and the field of textile design,
- 4. be able to describe and discuss a number of central art theory concepts within contemporary art,
- 5. be able to apply a selection of methods within contemporary art and use these as a starting point for carrying out their own artistic work,
- 6. be able to evaluate their creative process and artistic development.

Forms of Teaching

Tuition consists of supervision, seminars, workshops and lectures.

The language of instruction is Swedish. However, instruction in English may occur.

Forms of Examination

The course will be examined through the following examination elements:

Written assignment - (Learning outcomes 1-4, 6) Learning outcomes: Credits: 2 Gradingscale: Fail (U) or Pass (G)

Independent creative work - (Learning outcomes 5-6) Learning outcomes: Credits: 5.5 Gradingscale: Fail (U) or Pass (G) Student rights and obligations at examination are in accordance with guidelines and rules for the University of Borås.
