Content

- Composition principles, pattern, structure and colouring
- Traditional and new materials
- Material combinations and material processing
- Composites and textile techniques
- Textile manufacturing processes

Learning Outcomes

The course aims to deepen students' basic experimental and professional capacity for interpretation in traditional and new materials through the manipulation and processing of these materials.

After completing the course, students should be able to:

1. demonstrate interpretative ability through the practical application of deepened knowledge of materials, colour and form,
2. demonstrate knowledge of different types of textile and non-textile materials' properties and suitability for artistic expression and design functions,
3. demonstrate an understanding of the environmental impact of textile materials from a lifecycle perspective.

Forms of Teaching

Tuition consists of lectures, laboratory work, supervision, seminars and practical exercises.

The language of instruction is Swedish. However, instruction in English may occur.

The course will be examined through the following examination elements

- Assignment material science (Learning outcomes 2-3) 1,5 credits Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)
- Documented creative exercises and laboratories (Learning outcomes 1-3) 4,5 credits Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)
