Content

The course aims to develop the student's skills and abilities in applied design work based on given expressive, functional, technical, and sustainability market aspects through work-based training (internships) at an established company. The main content of the course is:

- Practical design-related work in a design studio or office at an established company
- Design development based on the chosen company
- Critical reflection on design management, design processes, and its ethical and sustainability issues in relation to the chosen company

Learning Outcomes

After completing the course with approved results, the student should be able to:

1. demonstrate knowledge and understanding of organised and experimental professional design work and its given conditions in terms of expression, function, technology, sustainability, and the market,
2. demonstrate knowledge of the design tools relevant to the company,
3. describe and critically reflect on the company's ethical and sustainability issues related to the chosen company.

Forms of Teaching

The teaching takes the form of practical experience, supervision and seminars.

The language of instruction is English.

Forms of Examination

The course will be examined through the following examination elements:

- Creative work linked to internship (Learning outcomes 1-3) 13,5 credits Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)
- Documented presentation linked to internship (Learning outcomes 1-3) 3 credits Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)
- Written reflection (Learning outcomes 3) 1,5 credits Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)

For the grade passed on the entire course, an approved grade is required for all parts.

If the student has received a decision/recommendation regarding special pedagogical support from the University of Borås due to disability or special needs, the examiner has the right to make accommodations when it comes to examination.
