Content

The course is based on a design project where students work together in smaller groups. The course also contains literature studies and seminars on design theory and design methodology. Through deepened studies of the theoretical foundations of the design process, the possibility of building more effective models and methods is created.

Learning Outcomes

The purpose of the course is to:

- deepen the understanding for theoretical foundations in, and principles for, systematic design work.
- provide deepened training in systemising the design process through the application of theoretical foundations and principles in practical activities.

On completion of the course, students shall be able to show ability to:

- to develop, and reflect on, the design process in a systematic manner through the application on modification of given general models and methods.
- to identify and explain basic concepts used to build given general models and methods,
- to identify, and with reference to given general design methods, describe decision points where analysis is turned into design (synthesis) in typical design process examples.

Forms of Teaching

- Seminar discussions
- Tutoring
- Active participation in the examination

The language of instruction is English.
