Content

The course aims to provide basic knowledge and perspective on the historical development of clothing and fashion through text, concept, and image studies. The main content of the course is:

- Historical and contemporary structures of fashion
- Fashion's producers and consumers
- Fashion as design, artefact, and social phenomenon

Learning Outcomes

After completing and passing the course, students should be able to:

1. describe and reflect on fashion's overall historical and contemporary structures and systems,
2. demonstrate basic understanding and insight into fashion as an artefact and social phenomenon,
3. identify and demonstrate basic knowledge of the design language and expression of various contemporary designers.

Forms of Teaching

Tuition consists of lectures, visualization and discussion forum.

The language of instruction is English.

Forms of Examination

The course will be examined through the following examination element:

- Documentation of analysis work (Learning outcomes 1-3), 4.5 credits, Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)

For the grade passed on the entire course, an approved grade is required for all parts
