Content

Presentation, demonstration and creative laboratory sessions in:

- Traditional and cultural materials.
- Combinations of materials, adaptations and textile techniques.
- Digital technology, composites, new materials and textile techniques.
- Composition principles, patterns, structures and dyeing.
- Materials and textile manufacturing processes.

Learning Outcomes

The course seeks to train students' basic experimental and professional creative abilities on the basis of traditional and new materials, textile techniques and manipulation and processing of materials through theoretical teaching and practical exercises. On successful completion of the course, students at basic level will be able to:

- demonstrate a creative ability by application and practical use of further developed skills in materials, textile techniques, colour and design.
- demonstrate knowledge of different types of textile and non-textile materials, their characteristics and appropriateness for artistic expression and design functions.
- demonstrate knowledge to identify, analyse and describe material for a creative purpose.
- show understanding of how the design work affects the living environment and people who work and live with materials and products.

The main focus of the course is on learning outcomes: 1a-b, 3a-b, 4a-b, 5a-b, 6a-b.

Forms of Teaching

Lectures, seminars, supervision, exercises, laboratory work and project work

Forms of Examination

The course will be examined through the following examination elements

- Documented independent creative exercises and laboratory work 15 credits Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)
