Content

The course seeks to train students' basic experimental and professional creative abilities on the basis of sustainable materials, textile techniques and manipulation and processing of materials through theoretical teaching and practical exercises. On successful completion of the course, students at basic level will be able to:

- Experimental strategies for sustainable materials in relation to fashion design
- Sportswear, outdoor, functional material and functional aesthetics
- Combinations of materials, adaptations and textile techniques.
- Composition principles, patterns, structures and dyeing.
- Materials and textile manufacturing processes
- Binding and sample weaving

Learning Outcomes

After completing the course the student should be able to:

1. demonstrate a creative ability by application and practical use of further developed skills in sustainable materials, textile techniques, colour and design.
2. demonstrate knowledge of different types of functional material, their characteristics and appropriateness for artistic expression and design functions.
3. demonstrate knowledge to identify, analyse and describe material for a creative purpose.
4. show understanding of how the design work affects the living environment and people who work and live with materials and products.

Forms of Teaching

Lectures, seminars, supervision, exercises, laboratory work and project work

The language of instruction is English.

Forms of Examination

The course will be examined through the following examination elements

- Documented independent creative exercises (Learning outcomes 1,2 and 4) 12 credits Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)
- Visually documented and orally presented exercises and laborations (Learning outcomes 3) 3 credits Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)
