In addition, the course requires that the student is admitted to an artistic programme at The Swedish School of Textiles, University of Borås, and has passed courses of at least 45 credits.

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### Content

The aim of the course is for students to have the opportunity to pursue their own design project. The student formulates a project plan, implements the design project, and evaluates and presents it. The main content of the course is:

- Material collection, processing of reference material and design ideas, conceptualisation, design development and composition.
- Sketching techniques, textile and fashion plates.
- Experimental design work
- Presentation skills.

### Learning Outcomes

After completing and passing the course, students should be able to:

1. demonstrate developed skills in design skills in textile and/or fashion design,
2. demonstrate a developed ability in independently pursuing and implementing design projects,
3. formulate their own approach to the design project with regard to sustainable development.

### Forms of Teaching

Tuition consists of supervision.

The language of instruction is English.

### Forms of Examination

The course will be examined through the following examination elements:

- Visual and verbal presentation of project work (Learning outcomes 1-3) 7,5 credits Grading scale: Pass/Fail
