#### Content

The course aims to provide a basic aesthetic perspective on the historical and contemporary development of clothing and textiles from an interdisciplinary perspective through both materials and text-based studies. The main content of the course is as follows:

- Textile and fashion history, primarily Western from the 1700s to the present
- Contemporary textile design, art and craftsmanship.
- Shape- and construction analysis of textiles

### **Learning Outcomes**

After completing and passing the course, students should be able to:

- 1. describe, relate and reflect on the aesthetic expression and development of different eras,
- 2. demonstrate interdisciplinary knowledge in textile, clothing and design history,
- 3. independently study and analyze textiles through practical work as well as theory.

# Forms of Teaching

Seminars, lectures, study visits and supervision.

The language of instruction is English.

#### **Forms of Examination**

The course will be examined through the following examination elements

- Presentation of project work (Learning outcome 1,2) 2 credits, Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)
- Documentation of analysis work (Learning outcome 2,3) 1.5 credits, Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)
- Active participation in seminar (Learning outcome 1,2) 1 credits, Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)

For the grade passed on the entire course, an approved grade is required for all parts.
