Content

The course aims to develop basic skills in design methodology to be able to handle complex design development tasks in a systematic way. The course also provides basic knowledge about idea generation, visualization, form, sketch and material development. The main content of the course is:

- Identifying and developing design methods
- Applying design methodology in project work
- Digital visualisation and presentation techniques
- Different design methods in relation to ethics and the environment

Learning Outcomes

After completing and passing the course, students should be able to:

- 1. demonstrate basic skills and capabilities in design methodology,
- 2. demonstrate basic knowledge and understanding of the role of design methodology in design development,
- 3. describe and analyse the design process of their own work,
- 4. demonstrate basic knowledge and understanding of the role of design methodology in terms of quality, ethics and the
- 5. demonstrate basic knowledge in digital visualization and presentation technology.

Forms of Teaching

Teaching consists of lectures and supervision.

The language of instruction is English.

Forms of Examination

The course will be examined through the following examination elements

- Documentation of and reflection on design methodology work (Learning outcomes 1-5) 5.5 credits Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)
- Oral presentation (Learning outcomes 1,3,5) 3.5 credits Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)

For the grade passed on the entire course, an approved grade is required for all parts.
