Content

The course aims to develop the student's knowledge of textile materials and their properties and to develop the student's design ability through experimental design development of structural design principles in relation to body and space. The main content of the course is:

- Physical, technical, and chemical properties of textile materials
- Study of the archetypal wardrobe and training in archetypal basic construction
- Design and shaping exercises in line, direction, proportion, volume, shape, and texture in relation to body and space
- Design and shaping exercises in geometry, perspective, and scale in 2D and 3D
- Joining principles and methods
- Digital garment sketch

Learning Outcomes

After completing the course, students should be able to:

1. demonstrate knowledge and understanding of different types of textile materials, fibres, and their properties and suitability in different areas of use,
2. demonstrate knowledge of archetypal clothing and skills in basic architectural design principles,
3. ability to design through the practical use and application of basic knowledge in textile form and materials,
4. demonstrate knowledge and ability to reinterpret and apply structural principles for function and expression based on body and space,
5. show proficiency in digital garment sketching and technical description of garments.

Forms of Teaching

Lectures, seminars, tutorials, and exercises.

The language of instruction is English.

Forms of Examination

The course is examined through the following examination elements:

- Documented independent creative work (Learning outcomes 2-5), 10 credits, Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)
- Written exam, material knowledge (Learning outcomes 2-5), 3 credits, Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)
- Laboratory work, material knowledge (Learning outcomes 1) 1 credit, Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)
- Assignments, material knowledge (Learning outcomes 1), 1 credit, Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)
