Content

The course aims to educate the student in pattern design and graphic expression when it comes to clothes and the body. The main content of the course is:

- Idea sketches, idea generation and design methods for pattern design and graphic expression
- Design exercises in patterns and the placement of graphics with a focus on direction, proportion, perspective, and scale in relation to garments
- Design exercises in colour composition in repeated patterns and placed graphics
- Digital methods for design development, processing, and printing
- Placed graphics and repeated patterns

Learning Outcomes

After completing the course, the student will be able to:

1. demonstrate knowledge and understanding of idea sketching, idea generation, and design methods for pattern design and graphic expression,
2. demonstrate skill and ability in the design and composition of placed graphics and repeated patterns with a focus on direction, proportion, perspective and scale in garments and in relation to the body,
3. demonstrate knowledge and understanding of the aspects of colours in repeated patterns and placed graphics in garments and in relation to the body,
4. demonstrate proficiency and ability in digital methods for design development, processing, and printing,
5. demonstrate skill and ability in composing and presenting examples of placed graphics and repeated patterns as a collection,
6. demonstrate the ability to critically discuss and evaluate the design of collections and compositions with graphics as a basic design idea.

Forms of Teaching

Lectures, exercises, tutorials and seminars.

The language of instruction is English.

Forms of Examination

The course will be examined through the following examination elements:

- Documented independent creative work (Learning outcomes 1-6) 4.5 credits Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)
