Content

This course provides an understanding of sustainability perspectives on design with a focus on fashion and clothing. The course introduces basic concepts, methods and strategies for the opportunities and challenges of design as a basis for sustainable development. The aim of the course is to provide students with the knowledge and skills to critically evaluate and formulate design strategies for different sustainability challenges. The main content of the course is:

- Basic concepts, perspectives, and strategies in design for sustainable development
- Aesthetic aspects in different strategies and design methods for sustainable design development in clothing and fashion
- Alternative and more sustainable design perspectives and the relationship of design methods to the clothing and fashion industry as a whole
- Evaluation of design strategies and methods for more sustainable production and consumption of clothing and fashion
- Critical perspectives on the environmental and social impact of clothing
- Ethical aspects of different design perspectives on sustainability development

Learning Outcomes

After completing the course, the student will be able to:

- 1. demonstrate knowledge and understanding of basic concepts, perspectives and methods in design for sustainable development,
- 2. demonstrate knowledge and understanding of aesthetic aspects in different models of sustainable design development in clothing and fashion,
- 3. demonstrate knowledge and understanding of alternative and more sustainable design perspectives and design methods in relation to the clothing and fashion industry as a whole,
- 4. demonstrate skills and abilities to explore opportunities for different design strategies for sustainable design development,
- 5. demonstrate skills and ability to argue for different design strategies and methods for more sustainable production and consumption of clothing and fashion,
- 6. demonstrate the ability to critically evaluate and discuss the impact of clothing on the environment and society,
- 7. demonstrate the ability to critically evaluate and discuss ethical aspects of different design perspectives on sustainability development.

Forms of Teaching

The teaching consists of lectures, self-studies and project work.

The language of instruction is English.
