Content

The course aims to develop understanding of and proficiency in fashion sketching, production sketching, and illustration as a tool for artistic interpretation, idea development, and communication in the field of fashion design. The main content of the course is as follows:

- Technique and mannerism
- Expression and proportion
- Idea development and design method
- Production and detailed sketches
- Compilation of portfolio presentation materials

Learning Outcomes

On completion of the course, students will be able to:

- 1. demonstrate basic knowledge and understanding for fashion sketches in terms of development and illustration of ideas in relation to body,
- 2. demonstrate basic skills and capabilities in fashion sketches for the development and illustration of ideas in relation to body,
- 3. demonstrate basic skill and capabilities in sketching techniques for different garment types and textile materials in relation to the body,
- 4. demonstrate basic knowledge and understanding for building up a collection and visualising in sketching.

Forms of Teaching

Tuition consists of web-based lectures, literature studies, e-supervision and project assignments.

The language of instruction is English.

Forms of Examination

The course will be examined through the following examination elements:

Submission of documented visual exercises and tasks Learning outcomes: 1-2 Credits: 7.5 Gradingscale: Fail (U) or Pass (G)

Submission and presentation of documented artistic interpretations Learning outcomes: 3-4 Credits: 7.5 Gradingscale: Fail (U) or Pass (G)

For the grade passed on the entire course, an approved grade is required for all parts.
