Content

The course aims to offer the student practical experiences of work within a company or organisation in order to deepen knowledge of design work in relation to sustainable, artistic and economical approaches. The course shall be conducted at a company/organisation with a design focus. The main content of the course is:

- Practical and company/organisation related design work in studio, workshops and/or labs
- Design development in relation to selected company/organisation
- Reflection in regards to selected process and sustainable issues in relation to selected company/organisation

Learning Outcomes

Upon completing the course, students should be able to:

- demonstrate knowledge and understanding for professional design work and its given opportunities in regards to expression, function, technique and market,
- demonstrate knowledge in softwares and tools that are relevant for the company/organisation
- demonstrate the ability and skills to conduct design work through the methods and expressions of the company/organisation through a series of examples,
- critically reflect upon sustainable and ethical issues in relation to selected company/organisation.

Forms of Teaching

The teaching takes the form of practical experience, supervision and seminars.

The language of instruction is English.

Forms of Examination

The course will be examined through the following examination elements:

- Creative work linked to internship (Learning outcomes 1-3) 13,5 credits Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)
- Documented presentation linked to internship (Learning outcomes 1-3) 3 credits Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)
- Written reflection (Learning outcomes 4) 1,5 credits Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)

For the grade passed on the entire course, an approved grade is required for all parts.

If the student has received a decision/recommendation regarding special pedagogical support from the University of Borås due to disability or special needs, the examiner has the right to make accommodations when it comes to examination.
