Content

The course aims to develop students' basic capacity for interpretation in textile materials through theoretical teaching and practical interpretative exercises within the form-, material- and colour-related aspects of the field of textiles. The main content of the course is:

- The physical, technical and chemical properties of textile materials
- Color theory
- Volume, form and texture in textiles
- Two-dimensional and three-dimensional shape in textile materials

Learning Outcomes

After completing the course, students should be able to:

1. account for different types of materials, fibres and their properties and suitability for use within different fields of application,
2. demonstrate knowledge in color theory and be able to identify, analyse and describe colours for interpretative purposes,
3. demonstrate interpretative ability through the application of basic knowledge of textile form, colour and materials.

Forms of Teaching

Tuition consists of lectures, laboratory work, supervision, seminars and exercises.

The language of instruction is English.

Forms of Examination

The course will be examined through the following examination elements:

- Written exam, material knowledge (Learning outcomes 1) 3 credits Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)
- Laboratory work, material knowledge (Learning outcomes 1) 1 credits Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)
- Assignments, material knowledge (Learning outcomes 1) 1 credits Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)
- Assignments, color theory (Learning outcomes 2) 3 credits Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)
- Creative work (Learning outcomes 3) 5,5 credits Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)
- Documented presentation of and reflection on starting points, methods and results (Learning outcomes 1-3) 1,5 credits Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)

For the grade passed on the entire course, an approved grade is required for all parts.
