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### Content

The course aims to develop students' experimental and professional capacity for interpretation, taking pattern composition, textile printing techniques and dyeing and finishing techniques as starting points. The course also aims to plan, carry out and present design work from initial idea through to the completion of textiles in relation to three-dimensionality.

- The development of design concepts and sketches; pattern, colour, scale, choice of materials and choice of printing and finishing techniques
- Experimental work in the studio, in workshops and in laboratories
- Research and analysis

### Learning Outcomes

After completing the course, students should be able to:

1. apply an investigative and experimental working method for idea development,
2. apply textile printing and finishing techniques in order to investigate opportunities for expression in textile materials,
3. develop textiles in relation to pattern, surface and three-dimensionality,
4. demonstrate how design work can affect the living environment and people who work and live with textile materials and products.

### Forms of Teaching

Tuition consists of lectures, seminars and supervision.

The language of instruction is English.

The course will be examined through the following examination elements

- Independent creative work (Learning outcomes 1-3) 8,5 credits Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)
- Documented presentation of and reflection on starting points, methods and results (Learning outcomes 1-4) 2 credits Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)
