Content

The course aims to further develop a given design programme from the advancement project through experimental design work. In this way, the course aims to further develop artistic skill and a deeper exploration into design methods and design concepts. The main content of the course is as follows:

- Development of the proposed design programme through experimental design work
- Experimental studio, workshop and lab work
- Exploration and development of portfolio components in relation to image composition and structure

Learning Outcomes

On completion of the course, students will be able to:

1. further develop a given design programme through experimental design work,
2. demonstrate an ability to develop their own design practice through an experimental way of working,
3. independently develop and reflect on composition methods, design principles and design expression,
4. demonstrate development and presentation possibilities of image material.

Forms of Teaching

The teaching takes the form of seminars, workshops and individual supervision.

The language of instruction is English.

Forms of Examination

The course will be examined through the following examination elements:

- Independent design work (Learning outcomes 1-4) 9 credits Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)
- Seminars (Learning outcomes 2,3) 1.5 credits Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)
- Documentation and reflection (Learning outcomes 2,3) 3 credits Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)
- Portfolio submission (Learning outcomes 4) 1.5 credits Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)

For the grade passed on the entire course, an approved grade is required for all parts.

If the student has received a decision/recommendation regarding special pedagogical support from the University of Borås due to disability or special needs, the examiner has the right to make accommodations when it comes to examination.
