Content

The course aims to develop artistic ability within weaving through the application and experimental investigation of the expressive and functional opportunities offered by different weaving techniques. The main content of the course is as follows:

- Weaving analyses
- Weaving theory with definitions and design of single and double weaving
- Design and sketch work of selected handlooms and weaving machines
- Experimental weaving
- Pattern production and sample weaving of shaft and jacquard weaving
- Yarn and weaving calculations
- Working methods and ways of thinking in relation to sustainable materials

Learning Outcomes

After completing the course, students should be able to:

- 1. analyse and describe the structure, properties, construction and patterning opportunities of different woven fabrics,
- 2. carry out yarn and weaving calculations for industrial weaving,
- 3. apply knowledge within weaving theory,
- 4. carry out and run experimental design work in weaving,
- 5. apply appropriate techniques and materials in relation to their own design concepts,
- 6. document and reflect on technology in relation to the design process,
- 7. demonstrate an understanding of sustainable materials and approaches.

Forms of Teaching

Tuition consists of lectures, seminars, laboratory work and tutoring.

The language of instruction is English.

Forms of Examination

The course is examined through the following examination elements:

- Written exam (Learning outcomes 1, 2) 2 credits Grading scale:PASS/FAIL
- Written assignment (Learning outcomes 3-5) 3 credits Grading scale:PASS/FAIL
- Documented presentation and reflection (Learning outcomes 4-7) 2,5 credits Grading scale: PASS/FAIL

For the grade passed on the entire course, an approved grade is required for all parts.

If the student has received a decision/recommendation regarding special pedagogical support from the University of
